### **Healthy Choices**

Thank you to all of you for your support in making sure we do the very best by your children. I would like to clarify a few points:

Snacks - fresh fruit or veg (this is applicable only to snack times.)

Lunch boxes – parents should consider healthy options (the school does not have any specific requirements for lunch boxes i.e. savouries, snack bars, crisps etc. or lunch box treats, only that we ask you to consider healthy ingredients.)

Chocolates and sweets (e.g. chocolate bars or Haribos) – not allowed. There are many reasons for this including direct impact on behaviour, concentration span, as well as the need to carefully monitor allergen content for health and safety reasons. The vast majority of these products often contain nuts.

Drinks – flavoured drinks/fruit juices are fine so long as they are of a 'no added sugar' variety or do not have a high sugar content.
