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

We have been learning how to dance the Samba and made up our own dance routines. Everyone has been working hard to improve our ball handling skills, as we are aiming to learn how to juggle as part of our STEAM circus challenge.





Linked to our new value we have been sharing what our hobbies are interests our and how they can inspire others in preparation for our class assembly next week.

The children were very excited to hear the news this week and they each received a pencil and we also won a voucher for B&Q! We are going to use it to help develop our sensory garden. Seacole class have been busy bees this week! They finished editing and improving their fact files about Banbury at the beginning of the week and in other English lessons, the children have rehearsed and performed a poem called the Sound Collector. They worked hard on their performance skills which will certainly help them in our circus performance at the end of the term. In maths, year 2 have been exploring money and using the knowledge to solve problems. In Times Table Rock Stars this week, Seacole class have really showed off how confident they are on the 10 times table, with many of them able to answer 60 questions correctly in under 3 minutes! Please continue to practice the 2 and 5 times table as we are working at being just as good at these. In the afternoons this week, the children have been working on circus skills like juggling, balancing and hula hooping. The class have also begun to make their own musical instruments using a variety of different media. If you have any plastic bottles, yogurt pots, plastic containers or tissue boxes lying around at home, please can you bring them in as we are continuing to make a variety of different musical instruments.



Valentina: It has been a super week in Valentina! We have been learning all about pictograms and how to interpret data. We completed our alternative Goldilocks Golden Write and have edited to show off our best writing skills that we've learned this year. The highlight of this week has been our trip to Greatworth Hall Farm Education Centre. We measured ingredients and learned to make pizzas from scratch, we fed the lambs and chickens, and we visited the pigs. We all sat in the combine harvester and learned about its job, we investigated different grains that are grown on the farm and we found out how to tell when wheat is ready to

harvest. We even had a go at herding sheep! We had such a fantastic day and learned so much - it was the most amazing opportunity and we are so grateful.

DaVinci: This week in DaVinci class the children have enjoyed working on and supporting the rehearsals for The Greatest Showman, it certainly is starting to take shape and promises to be a truly memorable show! In our maths lessons we are still working hard on conversions, this week we have been looking at seconds to minutes and also at hours and days. In our English work we formulated arguments justifying our opinions about the themes in the book we have been reading. Finally, the children were gripped by the story of Nick Vujicic (as we looked at our value of the month: inspiration) and how he has overcome severe disability in his life to be a real inspiration for others. If you are not familiar with his story you must ask your children.

Shakespeare: Shakespeare class have had a brilliantly busy week working on the production and preparing for sports day. We have been lucky enough to have a number of French lessons delivered by Mr Harper, a teacher from Tudor Hall. On Friday our classroom was transformed in to a French cafe where we were treated to croissants, paln au chocolat and drinks. More information about the production (dates, times and tickets) will be sent out next week.

Move up day: 8th July is our exciting annual move-up day. You will be given an opportunity to pop into school after drop-off at 8:40am to have a cup of tea or coffee for 20 minutes to meet your new teacher for next year. 
Value of the Month: Inspiration - the process of being mentally stimulated to do something creative
