**Darwin:** In Darwin Class this week we have started our topic on 'The Farm' in preparation for our trip to Cotswold Farm Park, which is next Wednesday 10th July. The children have learnt about the different animals that they will find on the farm and made a variety of animal masks, which are on display in the classroom. If you would like to come and see them, you are very welcome!

We have continued to learn about our class story 'The Little Red Hen' and the children have started to think about their own versions of the story, which they will be writing in their Literacy lessons.

The children have been learning about the new Value of the Month, which is 'Teamwork' and joined the whole school in learning about this value in an assembly. They have been working as a team and painting a large picture of a tractor, barn and animals, which will go up on display.

Next week the children will be meeting their new teacher and experiencing some time in their new classroom. Please do talk with your child about this new move up into Year 1, in order to prepare them for this.

**Important reminder**- for the trip next week, your child needs a named packed lunch (unless you have asked for the school to provide you with one), a water bottle, sun hat/ sun tan lotion and a rain coat if it is wet.

**Kandinsky:** This week we have been reflecting on the new value team work and what qualities we need to help us work collaboratively. In literacy, we have been reading Jabuti by G McDermott which is a trickster tale from the amazon. In the character of the vulture we have written letters of apology to Jabuti. In maths we have been using positional language to physically move a quarter, half and three quarter turns in PE and relating this to tell the time on and half past the hour. We have been practising sprinting and improving our times in preparation for the running races.

**Seacole:** Seacole class have been busy perfecting their performances ready for our STEAM showcase on Wednesday. They have shown great team work in doing this and have been offering advice and support to each other, which has been great to see. In our English lessons, the class have been writing their own Sound Collector poems and in Maths they have been practicing answering money problems where there is change. As we come closer to the end of term Seacole class are reflecting on their time in Year 2 and have written what they have enjoyed and have been most proud of. Also in our PE lessons the children have been continuing to practice their running, ready for next week's races.



**Valentina:** This week in Valentina, we have developed our knowledge of how to present data by looking at bar charts and considering how they differ from pictograms. In English we watched a brilliant video called The Catch and noticed how much storytelling happened without any speaking! It inspired us to think about factors such as music and facial expressions and how these can tell a story as well as dialogue in a film. We managed to complete our Sports Day activities whilst trying to earn our July wristband for the value of teamwork. Our value of the month has been a central part of our discussions as we have begun to prepare for our assembly next week. We have talked about a few big questions such as 'Does every team need a leader?' and 'Which other values do you show if you are showing teamwork?' We even gave ourselves a challenge to see who could name the most values without looking -

the current leader managed 11! Hopefully we'll remember all of them by the end of the year. We are all super excited for the Greatest Showman next week and we have been practicing extra hard - hopefully we will see you all there!

**DaVinci:** In DaVinci class we feel like we have been performing all week; but we have thoroughly enjoyed it! Our first performance was our class assembly all about our value of the month: teamwork. The children had lots to say and were fantastic at getting across the value of teamwork and how so much can be achieved through it. On Thursday afternoon was our brass showcase; the children performed the pieces they have been learning all throughout the year. They were fantastically confident and inspired the rest of the children in the school to take up playing an instrument. On top of this the children have also been showing great determination to ensure that our end of year show, 'The Greatest Showman' is a great success, with the year 5s confidently joining the acting cast and the year 4s providing some excellent singing.

**Shakespeare:** What an incredible week for Shakespeare class. The Year 6 children spent two days at their new secondary schools which was very exciting. The Year 5 children spent time supporting other classes with their learning and completing projects in the classroom.
