CORONAVIRUS SCHOOL CLOSURE PROCEDURE - IMPORTANT

The school has been planning and preparing for the possibility of a school closure, it is better to be over prepared than under prepared! The school will follow advice from the Department for Education, Public Health England and GLF Central Team before any decision was made. Should the school have to close, teachers are preparing electronic packs of work which would be delivered using Class Dojo or Tapestry on a daily basis. **Please ensure that you have all downloaded and are familiar with the following: Tapestry (nursery and reception parents), Class Dojo (Year 1 - Year 6), School App, Email and Website access.** If you have any problems accessing any of these, please speak to someone in the office.

We ask that you do not discuss the possibility of school closing with your children, this is for your information only. It could cause them to become unnecessarily alarmed. We are teaching children to be hygienic and to understand that this is a problem for grown-ups so they don't need to worry.

Darwin: Darwin have been enjoying lots of different stories this week, they all enjoyed dressing up as their favourite characters for world book day. The children have been learning about why it's important to wash their hands when playing outside, after using the toilet and before they eat.

Thank you to all the children for donating their old toys to nursery, the children have enjoyed washing them "we are spring cleaning".

We have also been practicing writing our numbers this week.



Cartwright: This week Cartwright class have been reading the story, 'The Dot' by Peter H. Reynolds. The children had a discussion about self-belief and what they think they were good at. They then created some art work taken inspiration from the story. In maths, the children have been learning about comparing numbers using the terms, 'more than', fewer than' and 'equal to'. They were then given the opportunity to investigate and compare numbers independently. It was World Book Day this week and the children dressed up as story book characters and enjoyed having a day celebrating the importance of books.



Kandinsky: Kandinsky all looked AMAZING in their World Book Day costumes. I am very proud of how respectful they were to our guest reader who read us a brand-new book! We had a fun filled day listening to stories written by Julia Donaldson, drawing our favourite characters, designing book marks, performing a story and buddy reading.



Seacole: We had a fantastic World Book Day and thoroughly enjoyed our mystery guest reader reading, 'The Bear Under the Stairs'. We have been reflecting on why we enjoy reading, discussing favourite authors and sharing our books together. Thank you to everyone who came to Bedtime and Biscuits and for making the effort to dress up. In Literacy this week we have been developing our reading comprehension skills using inference and quickly scanning a text to find evidence to support our answers.



In maths we have been applying our mental arithmetic skills to solve number problems in our maths booklets. We have been identifying multiplication facts and repeated addition calculations as part of our multiplication and division maths topic.

In STEAM we have been thinking about Pop Art and learning how to use proportion to draw self-portraits. We are looking forward to visiting the Ironstone Art Exhibition next week as a stimulus for our own Art Work. We have been reflecting about compassion and tolerance as our new values this month.

Valentina: Valentina have had a magical week! In English, we have continued to read the Spy Master (A murder mystery novel set in the Tudor Period). We have performed the story in groups in front of the class and used it to inspire our own pieces of writing. We have focused on our use of speech, learning that when a new speaker is talking we must begin a new line. In Maths we have continued with rounding, applying what we have learnt to estimate the answers to a range of different problems. During our STEAM lessons, we have been experimenting with mixing colours by creating a 'colour wheel' using the primary colours red, yellow and blue. The highlight of the week however has to be WORLD BOOK DAY. Everyone in the class made a real effort to celebrate the day with fantastic fancy dress. We thoroughly enjoyed some quiet time in our cosy Narnia inspired den where we read the Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe. We cannot wait to read the sequel: Prince Caspian.



Da Vinci: This week in Da Vinci class we have been finding out all about the Vikings and how they began invading Anglo Saxon England. We learnt all about the first gruesome attack on the monastery of Lindisfarne and will use this battle for our newspaper report story. In maths we have been learning all about tenths and hundredths and their decimal equivalents. We also really enjoyed World book day yesterday and had great fun dressing up as our favourite book characters.



Shakespeare: Shakespeare had a fantastic World Book Day! We continued to plan our own independent Ancient Greek myths which will eventually be made into a class book when completed. We then launched our new class novel for this half term - Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief! We have been exploring how the author creates a sense of mystery at the start of the story and discussing our impressions of each of the main characters so far. It was difficult to put the book down at the end of the day! We also joined up with year 1 for some shared reading; it was lovely to see the children supporting the younger pupils and practising reading with expression to a younger audience.

Cycling Proficiency: We are looking for volunteers to help run Cycling Training for the children at our school (formally known as cycling proficiency). You need to be able to ride a bike own your own and feel confident riding it on roads. All volunteers would

be fully trained by Oxfordshire County Council to deliver the cycling training to the children. We are looking to run this in the next few months, it would involve 7 sessions with a small group of children from year 6, each session lasting 1 hour 30mins.
