
Cartwright – We will be focusing on 3D shapes this week. They will be asked to do various fun activities related to them. We will start the week of with an

Friday 27th March:






Or search for **Piota**. The icon is blue and looks like this:

Using the app

Once downloaded and after your child is enrolled with us and has started, you will be able to register your device with the app, by clicking on the padlock icon:



This will enable us to tailor information to you as a parent. We can send messages to class groups and

even individually, so it's really important that you register your device as soon as you are able. Please ensure you allow the app to send notifications as this will alert you to any information that we are sending you.
