

We were developing our multi skills by throwing and catching different sized balls as well as focussing on counting how many times we could keep the bean bag on the parachute in our houses. We had a great start to our P.E lesson and finished it inside developing our co-ordination with Go Noodle dances remembering our 'chicken wings' for social distancing. In our Literacy this week we have started to read the story of Rapunzel and have been developing our predicting skills by discussing what we think will happen next. **Valentina:** It has been a brilliant start to the Autumn term in Valentina class. It has been lovely to see the children return to school and to have settled back into a routine so quickly. In English we begun reading The Iron Man, by Ted Hughes. The children are so intrigued to find out what happens next! We have been using this text to identify nouns and adjectives within sentences, whilst thinking about why the author chose to use them. In Maths we have been identifying different ways that one hundred can be composed. So far, we have found out that one hundred can be composed of ones, tens, twenties, twenty-fives and fifties. The children have worked incredibly hard and have been representing these compositions in numerous ways, such as through using part-whole models and bar models. In STEAM we have begun our Maths topic with the question, 'Can I create, carry out an experiment and present my data in a variety of different ways?' We have completed some observational investigations where we looked at the forces required when using different pieces of play equipment and the effects of push and pull forces on different surfaces. It has been a great first week back at school and we are looking forward to seeing what the rest of the term brings. Well done Valentina class!

**Ramanujan:** What a brilliant start to year 4! Well done Ramanujan for settling back into school life so quickly. It is lovely to have you all back and I have been very impressed with your hard work so far. Whilst we wait to discover more, we have started discussing the purpose of letters and their structure.
