Covid Reminders

It is very important that you please stick to your allocated drop off and collection slots. Thank you to the majority of parents who have been doing this.

Please also avoid congregating outside of the school gate to speak to other parents before or after dropping your children off, as this is making some members of our community uncomfortable with having to walk past groups of people.

If anyone in the school has any of the COVID19 symptoms they need to test first – numbers of positive cases are increasing locally as well as nationally so we need to rule COVID19 out before they return to school.

When to self-isolate

The medical advice, is clear: you must self-isolate if you have coronavirus symptoms or live in the same household as somebody who does. The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- · high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- · new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- · loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Once COVID19 has been ruled out then you can determine if your child is feeling well enough to be at school. The advice regarding regular coughs such as nasal drip or asthmatic coughs is — would you be confident that the cough was not COVID19? Ruling it out whilst we are in a pandemic with numbers increasing would be recommended.

At the end of this newsletter is a flow chart to support you in your decision making process.




Valentina:

We have identified where the author used expanded noun phrases to describe the Iron Man, and we have begun writing our own expanded noun phrases to describe the main characters. During Maths we have continued to discover different ways we can compose 100. We have used representations such as part-whole models, partitioning and bar models to show this. In STEAM we conducted an experiment where we were investigating the effect that different surfaces have on the force of an object. It was great to see the children so engaged within the investigation.

In maths we have been continuing to explore place value with numbers to 1000. In STEAM we have discussed the properties of solids, liquids and gases and have planned our very own experiment regarding the change of state — melting. We discussed how we would ensure a fair test and decided on which suitable materials to use for our experiment. We look forward to conducting the experiment next week.


