On Tuesday we began our music lessons with Oxfordshire Music Service. The class loved listening to the cornet, baritone and trombone and are really looking forward to learning to play one of these brass instruments this year. In reading this week we have delved deeper into our class text 'Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Carroll; the curse is looking very real and incredibly sinister. We have studied several related texts and consideration a range of language choices and the impact that they have on the reader. In English we have planned and begun to write our narrative set near the foot of a volcano. We generated some fantastic vocabulary using a time lapse video of the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79AD and are looking forward to writing the rest of our story in the coming week. During our mathematics lessons we have been halving numbers, finding the midpoint between two numbers, and placing numbers greater than 100,000 on a number line. The odd digits have confused us at times, but we have persevered and made great progress! Our STEAM topic has continued to inspire us. This week we have looked in more detail at specific volcanoes and made our own 'Volcano Top Trumps' which became quite competitive! We debated whether we would like to live near a volcano and we also discovered that a couple of incredibly brave members of our class have climbed a volcano!

What to do if your child is unwell

Please e-mail or phone the office to let us know the reason for their absence. Your child, <u>must</u> self-isolate immediately and arrange to have a test should your child display any one of the following symptoms:

- a new, continuous cough;
- a high temperature; or
- a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell.

If we observe any of these symptoms in school, we will call you to collect all of your children and take them home. You will then need to organise a test for the child displaying symptoms. A positive result means the children needs to isolate for 10 days. A negative result means the child can return to school immediately.

Reminder : If you need to report your child's absence then please call or email the school office. Please do not message teachers on Class Dojo as this doesn't always get seen straight away.

If your child requires a leave of absence not related to illness, then you can collect a 'Absence request form' from the school office.
