The children in Cartwright Class have had a fantastic first week together! They have been busy getting to know each other's names, learning the routines of the day and engaging in the many fun activities on offer. We have started our STEAM topic and the children have engaged in activities linked to our story of the week 'Hooray for bread' by Allan Ahlberg. They have painted on bread, discussed the types of bread that can be bought in the shops and had a great time trying different varieties for themselves! We have introduced the Read Write Ink sounds and will be starting our phonics sessions next week. The children will be learning a sound a day, so look out for the phonics sheets that will be sent home soon. In maths the children have been learning about the numbers up to 4 and recognising the different patterns of dots that can represent that number. If you would like to play a game at home this weekend, you could find a dice with just dots displayed and see if your child can recognise what number it has landed on. Can they jump, skip or clap to match the number? Well done children for a wonderful first week of school!

#### **Kandinsky:**

The children have completed their first full week in year 1 and WOW! They have been amazing. The children are settling into the classroom routines extremely well and working their little socks off. In English, our text is 'The Scarecrow's Wedding' and the children have been working on using their phonic knowledge to sound out words to form labels and simple sentences. In maths, the children have been counting forwards and backwards within 20, comparing classroom items according to length and height and looking closely at the composition of the number 5. In STEAM this week, the children began to explore different materials. The looked at different objects and grouped them according to their material. They looked at: plastic, metal, wood, fabric, glass and clay.

We have loved recapping our knowledge of electrical circuits and have taken apart hairdryers to look at the internal components. At the end of the term, we will be using the knowledge that we gain in these lessons to make an electronic device for collecting litter.
