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Learning this week: 6th October 2022

Darwin:

The children have been learning about harvest this week, we have been learning that farmers used to save some of their crops to give to people who did not have any food, we have been talking about how we can donate food to a Food Bank to help others. In maths this week we have been making patterns with our bodies, the children continue the patterns. We have been using coloured beads to make repeating patterns.

The children have been focusing on the number 4 in their maths work this week. They have made collections of 4 objects, used their fingers to show 4, and noticed the 4 sides on a square. In our STEAM sessions we have been learning to collect data. Each child chose their favourite type of bread, and they gathered their findings in a tally chart. The class have been recording other preferences for example, by voting on the story to be read at the end of the day. We have continued to learn the Set 1 phonics sounds and the children are beginning to blend sounds together to make simple words. The children had fun in P.E learning to balance on one leg and then trying to hop. There was quite a lot of wobbling! Well done for a super week Cartwright class.

Kandinsky:

This week in English, the children have continued with the focus text 'Room on the Broom'. The children have been working on their sentence writing skills to start with a capital letter, separate words with finger spaces and punctuate with a full stop.

I'm Maths, the children have been working on sharing an amount equally between two groups and more and less. In STEAM, our focus has been art and the children had a go at printing onto fabric using string, a cork and fruit. This will inform their final design of our class curtain.

Well done to everyone in Seacole class this week! In Maths, we have been looking at how each two-digit number can be partitioned into a tens part and a ones part. We have been drawing part-whole models and bar models to represent this. In English, we have been continuing to look at a diary entry from The Wolf. We have been exploring how we can use conjunctions such as 'and' in our writing and where we use our capital letters and full stops. In STEAM, we have been exploring different skills used in sewing. We have been practising a running stitch using Binca, thread and a needle. We also chose between a popper, button or Velcro to sew on to a piece of fabric. We really enjoyed this activity!

We have created art work depicting the iron man to develop their vocabulary for describing his appearance. I have loved reading the children's descriptions of these so far.

Star Reader - Miya, retrieving information from the class text.


Ramanujan:
