The children have had fun playing in the dark den which we created outside and in our new 'bedroom' role play area. In maths the children have learnt to order the days of the week. We listened to Prime Minister Neville Chamberlian's speech to the nation and thought about what it might have felt like to sit as a family around the radio and listen to the news that the country was at war again. We then thought about how the children in the cities must have felt as they were evacuated to the countryside, leaving their mothers behind. In mathematics we have been applying our knowledge of sequencing and rounding numbers to 7-digit numbers and then to help us solve problems.
