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Learning this week: 25th November 2022

Darwin:

This week as part of our steam the children have been learning how to use their scissors safely, we have learning how we hold our scissors and move them around the paper. The older children have been helping the younger children by showing them how to cut along the lines. The children have been practising their cutting skills they have learnt to create a lantern, they listen to the instructions and cut along the lines. We have also been learning what glue is and how we use glue, the children used different gluing techniques to create a Gruffalo.

We have been reading the Gruffalo's Child and have been learning about shadows and how the mouse made himself look bigger in the moon light.

Cartwright:

This week we have been making shelters by fixing boxes together using tape and glue. The children learnt that to make houses, concrete can be mixed to join the bricks together. They roleplayed building by mixing sand and water to make 'concrete' and joined blocks together to create a wall. The children have looked at pictures of different shelters and have begun to identify a range of features, such as the roof and entrance. Our focus text this week was 'A little bit brave' by Nicola Kinnear and the children used their phonics knowledge to label items in a 'being brave' bag. In maths the children have been investigating part–part–whole relations, e.g. seeing that 3 can be composed of 1 and 2. Through practical experience, they have noticed that the whole can be made up of smaller parts. We have begun to rehearse a selection of Christmas carols for our sing-along at the end of term. The children might like to practice singing 'Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer' at home!

Kandinsky:

This week in English, the children have planned, edited and published their setting descriptions. I really enjoyed reading the them all and it was fantastic to see some children adding 'and' to add an additional adjective to their descriptions. In Maths, the children have continued to partition numbers within ten multiple different ways. In STEAM this week, the focus has been D&T. The children worked together to join different materials using a range of techniques. They then discussed which was the best to inform their final product.

Chawla:


