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# **Learning this week:** 9<sup>th</sup> December 2022

### **Darwin:**

This week in maths we have been reading the story Dear Zoo, we were looking at the different sizes of all the animals the children had to find a box that was tall or long enough for their animal to fit inside. The children also used their phonic skills to label the animals from the story. In maths we have focused on shape, space and measure. **Star Reader** –. Patrick for his consideration and application of the archaic language and themes in lessons looking at The Raven.






#### Davinci:
