KS1 SATS Week : 15th – 26th May 2023

Darwin Class:

This week in nursery, as part of our steam learning, we went to Stratford to visit the butterfly farm and we were extremely proud of the children as they all listened and followed instructions from the class teachers and parent helpers. We saw lots of different butterflies; the children noticed the different sizes and colours. We also got to touch a centipede and a snake. We listened really carefully to instructions on how we needed to touch them, and we were all really brave. Cartwright Class:

Our focus text this week was 'Supertato' and linked to this, the children wrote a sentence imagining what their superpowers would be if they were a superhero. Some examples included: 'I wish I was super strong' and 'I wish I had super speed'. As part of their work on 'Supertato', some of the children made their own vegetable friends using potatoes, carrots, googly eyes, pipe cleaners and felt tipped pens. In maths the children have been thinking about different ways to make 5. They used the fingers of 1 hand, looking carefully at the fingers that were 'up' and those 'folded down', connecting this to a rhyme about 5 kittens jumping 'down' from the bed. Perhaps you could ask your child to sing this song to you, using their fingers to help. In STEAM we have been looking at closely at the texture of leaves and learning how to record observations of plants by drawing.



In mathematics, we have continued to look at teen numbers and used our knowledge of these numbers to help us solve problems. We have then moved on to thinking about how we can work out whether a teen number is odd or even. In STEAM, we have each chosen a vertebrate to create for our STEAM Showcase. We have drawn our animal and have found out facts about our creature. We are really looking forward to getting out the clay next week!

What a fantastic week in Year 2! In Maths, we have been recapping our knowledge on addition and subtraction. We have explored what we mean by partitioning and used this method to support our understanding. Our focus has been on adding and subtracting 2 two-digit numbers. In English, we have started our new unit looking at a fact-file of a Butterfly. Our end goal is to create our own fact-file based on our chosen animal. This week we explored how we can use an apostrophe for possession. We explored a range of different sentences and identified where the apostrophe needed to go. We then independently wrote a short paragraph describing what a butterfly looks like. Our STEAM this week was focused on researching our chosen animal. We were put into groups of 5 and then chose the animal we wanted to explore and find out about. These animals were; penguins, chameleons, camels, sharks and crocodile. To find the information, we used a range of QR codes with links to websites with facts all about our animal. We journaled this onto our non-chronological reports and collected our research, ready to present in our natural history programme.

This week we have been revising some of our skills we have been practising in the past few weeks, gearing up for our Golden Write about 'The Tin Forest'. The children have worked really hard on editing and improving their paragraphs and we shall continue to practise this essential skill. As always we are keeping up with our handwriting practise and the children's presentation is improving as a result which is wonderful to see. In Maths the children are growing in confidence with our non-unit fractions topic. We have been practising a lot of verbal reasoning questions this week including lots of partner discussions or justifying our knowledge. We have used practical examples and visual aids which really helps the children to understand which fraction is represented and why. In French this week we had a PE lesson. The children listened to instructions in French and moved around accordingly; jumping, skipping, running etc. They then gave their partner instructions and it was great to hear the children speaking more confidently, aloud in French.

In STEAM, we have identified that a large amount of food in the supermarkets have been imported from other countries.
