They then had a talk from three Firefighters about their job and got taught how to recognise and stay safe if there is ever a fire. The children asked some good questions and listened really intently. We have been finishing off our STEAM activities this week and have been looking closely at everything that has been growing in our classroom. Our sunflowers are getting tall, the Broad Beans have roots and shoots, and the cress looks good enough to eat! The children have made some careful observations for their Artwork and drawn what they could see. In Literacy, the children wrote about what they could see and described the plants using the conjunction 'and'. Our focus story has been 'Oliver's Vegetables' by Vivian French. In Maths, we have been singing the song '10 Fat Sausages, sizzling in a pan' and acting it out with frying pans and playdough sausages. The children have also been counting in two's, matching up the socks and wellies. Maybe your child could teach you the song over the weekend and practice counting in twos with you? Seacole class had superb week! In Maths, we have been focusing our knowledge on the four operations; multiplication, division, addition and subtraction. We have been developing our understanding through answering arithmetic questions as well as solving word problems. We used several resources such as dienes and number grids to support our understanding. In English, we have started to draft our Fact File for our chosen animal. We first focused on writing about the animals diet, making sure to include capital letters, full stops and a range of adjectives to describe the nouns in the sentences. Year 2 have came up with some fantastic describing words! In STEAM, we had a fun, art-based lesson creating our back drops for the habitat of our chosen animals. We first used our sketch books to explore the different colours and tones we would need depending on the habitat of our animal and practiced this by creating swatches of a range of colours. We then used these colours to paint on a wide sheet of paper, having sketched out an outline for our habitats whilst demonstrating our school values of determination and teamwork. Seacole Class had a lot of creative fun making these!
