This week in Cartwright Class, the children have started their new STEAM topic on Celebrations and Performing Arts and thinking about the big question 'Can I explore festivals and celebrations from around the world?' We have set up a stage area in the garden and the children have loved dancing, singing and playing instruments to an audience. They can just be part of the audience if they so wish but must have purchased a ticket beforehand! As the term goes on we will be learning about different celebrations and having our own Graduation Ceremony on the stage. Our focus book of the week was the well-loved 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson. The children have used their knowledge of 'Colourful Semantics' to write sentences about characters in the story. We are focusing particularly on using finger spaces this half term, so please do remind the children of this when writing at home. In Maths, we have had a whole week on Shape, Space and Measure and the children have been learning about building with blocks. They have learnt vocabulary such as 'enclosures', 'corners' and 'arches' and have attempted to build towers and houses with these criteria in mind.

We love the start of term and beginning new topics! In English, we began to look at the book 'George and the Dragon' by Chris Wormell. We have thought about how we can describe the dragon and come up with fantastic 'What like?' words. In mathematics, we have been looking at money and using our skills of counting in twos and fives to help us count different amounts of money. We began our Performance Unit in STEAM by looking at each of the countries in the United Kingdom. As part of this activity, we tried a variety of traditional food from each country. The cream that went on top of our strawberries and scones was a definite favourite!

#### **Seacole Class:**





Year 2 have had a fantastic first week back to school! In Maths, we have been focusing on multiplication and division, with a focus on the strategies we can use to find the quotient. We have been using our knowledge of our 2,5 and 10 times tables as well as answering a range of word problems. In English, we started our new unit looking at the story of Where the Night Came From. This text links to our STEAM unit as the story originated in Brazil. We have looked at how to use verbs in the past tense, expanded noun phrases and a range of conjunctions in our writing. We have applied these skills when writing the beginning, middle and end of the story. In STEAM, we have started our new topic looking at the cultures and celebrations celebrated in Rio de Janeiro. This week, we started to explore the physical and human features of Rio de Janeiro using decodable texts, videos and photos to find the answers and apply our knowledge to a range of comprehension questions. We journaled a range of questions as well as discussed the similarities and differences between our locality and Rio de Janeiro.

This week the children have written their first 2 paragraphs of their letter to George Eustice MP. They used all the taught features and wrote a fantastic opening paragraph as well as a factual second section for their persuasive letters. This tied in beautifully with World Oceans Day. The children enjoyed learning more about our oceans and the different things we can do to protect wildlife within them. We have also created a display outside the Year 3 classroom in which the children will also display their Golden Write letters once they are completed. We had a revision week to finish off fractions and the children have done really well with this topic as it has been challenging at times! The children have planned and begun to research information on their chosen European countries this week for STEAM. They have been working in pairs to research Weather, Climate, Local Cultures and Food and Drink native to their country. This project will continue for several weeks and be presented in the style of a travel guide.

In Maths, we have been using our times tables knowledge to help us convert improper fractions into mixed numbers. In Writing, we have been exploring and comparing different versions of the tales of Anansi, which we are using to inspire our own. In STEAM, we have started our final learning journey of Year 4, investigating the physical and human geographical features of Ghana and Morocco, comparing them to that of the United Kingdom. The children enjoyed exploring different exports and images from different African countries and cultures, feeling inspired for their own projects and research.
