We have also been looking ahead to the Reception class graduation and the things that we might need to celebrate this occasion. The children decided that we need; a gown, a mortar board and a scroll. In maths, the class have been exploring the 'rekenreks' which are like small abacuses. They have learnt to set the red beads - 'reds at the ready' and then select the correct number to push to the side. On Wednesday the children visited the MAF aeroplane and were given the opportunity to sit inside. They made their own paper aeroplanes and took turns to fly them towards the target.

Kandinsky Class:

This week the children have tried incredibly hard to stay focused during the hot weather. In English, we have continued our writing inspired by the characters in our 'George and the Dragon' story. We have thought about how we would describe the mouse's character and considered what the images in the book show us about the story. We completed our own freeze frames to help us understand how the mouse was feeling at different parts of the story. In mathematics, we have continued to learn about all the different coins that we have. We have thought about different ways to make 5p, 10p, 20p and 50p and compared different amounts of money. In STEAM, we have continued to study the United Kingdom. This week we thought about the physical characteristics of the four countries and discovered what is similar and what is different in each country. We were also treated to a visit from MAF and thoroughly enjoyed the chance to sit in one of the aeroplanes that they use to deliver aid to isolated places.

Seacole Class:





We have had a very exciting week in Seacole Class! In Maths, we have been continuing to focus on multiplication and division, focusing on how we can recognise a number in the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. We have been grouping numbers into 'Can be divided by 5' and 'Cannot be divided by 5'. In English, we have drafted and published our retelling of the story 'Where the Night Came From'. We have been making our stories our own by changing key parts such as a basket instead of a bag. We have made sure to include all the skills we have learnt such as noun phrases, exclamation marks and conjunctions. In STEAM, we continued to explore the cultures and celebrations celebrated in Rio de Janeiro. At the beginning of the week, we generated questions about the carnival and we then explored a range of stimulus to immerse ourselves in the Rio carnivals, such as samba music, costumes, film clips and photos. We used all we had learnt to create a mood board about the carnival. For our next lesson we explored how plants grow to contextualise our DT learning when we make our own dish. We grouped foods that were produced from plants and animals before watching a time lapse all about how a seed germinates. We then tapped into our creative side and sketched the germination process to show how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants - I was so impressed with their artistic skills!

We have begun our Angles topic in Maths and the children have really enjoyed some hands on activities using 2D shapes to spot patterns and other shapes within arrangements. We shall be continuing to practise for Sports Day next week and hope to see as many of you there as possible.
