Seacole Class:



We have had a fantastic week in Seacole Class! In Maths, we have been looking at how we can use First, Now and Then stories so add three addends. We have been using different representations to support our understanding such as tens frames, part-whole models and number lines. In English, we have shifted our focus from the diary of the Wolf to looking at a diary entry through the perspective of Little Red. We have been retelling the story through story-mapping and orally retelling it to a partner. We will be using the story of Little Red to write our own diary entries for our final golden write. In our curriculum lessons this week, we have finally started creating our final products for our bears. For our first lesson, we chose the two pieces of material we wanted to use for our coats. We then used our templates to draw around both pieces of material. We worked fantastically as a team, helping each other to hold the template still. We then cut around both pieces of material, ready to attach together. In our second lesson, we focused on stitching the two pieces together. We used our running stitch that we had practiced previously to sew around the edge of the materials. Well done for a fantastic week Year 2!

Star Reader - Kaio for his focus and positive attitude in his phonics lessons.


Chawla Class:

We have focused on the use of expanded noun phrases to add details and prepositions of time to ensure that our recounts are written in chronological order. In Maths, we have been measuring items in our classroom and converting measurements between centimetres and metres using our knowledge of place value. In our wider curriculum sessions, we have been designers, creating our prototypes and evaluating these ready to create our final products next week. The children were incredibly careful whilst they were sawing their wooden materials. Amazing job, Chawla!

The children worked very hard during our practical session using clay this week. Each child has drawn and designed a bird bath (linked to our Project topic – The Water Cycle). They spent a good amount of time using clay to form their baths which once dry they will paint and decorate. We have had a big recap during our Maths fluency sessions this week on pounds and pence. Lots of children have benefitted from recapping names of coins and values. We have also been adding pounds and pence. Please do show your children at home coins and ask them to add simple amounts together as this will help reinforce this skill in a real way! Having finished our writing about The Water Cycle, the children will be completing their own report next week based on 'States of Matter'. We shall be writing about melting, freezing and heating. Again, do chat to your child at home about these processes and think of examples around the home in which these may be relevant.
