


WILLIAM MORRIS NEWS

Beech: Beech class have been learning all about boats, how they work and different types. The children have had lots of fun building boats and working out how many pennies it would take to sink them - the record was 33!! We have been creating repeating patterns using all sorts of bright colours and designs. Year 1 children have been writing about Mr Gumpy using adjectives. A really fun week - well done everybody.

Willow: Willow class have had a fun week creating collages of flowers, tackling tricky reading questions and learning how to multiply money in maths. We have also produced some wonderfully informative leaflets about reptiles and insects.

Elm: In Elm, we have been using collage and mixed media to create dramatic Volcano pictures and the children have created beautiful Roman oil lamps using clay. In Literacy, we have writing sentences using ambitious vocabulary, to imagine what it would have been like to visit the Colosseum and watch contests between gladiators. In Numeracy, we have been using our division facts related to the four and eight times tables to solve calculations.

Cherry: As ever, it has been a busy week in Cherry Class. The children had great fun analysing the emotions in the film Inside Out as part of the work they are doing with Mrs Jones, called Zones of regulation. This is a scheme designed to help children identify different emotions they or others may be feeling and the best way of dealing with these emotions. On Tuesday, Cherry class had a great time on the Life Bus; during which we learnt about the importance of staying healthy and how to say no to peer



pressure when confronted by drugs or cigarettes.

Redwood: This week has been SOOO busy. We had a lesson on the Life Bus, learning about drugs and being safe. Some for the children took part in an assembly where they had to perform in front of Key Stage 2. The children have started making

prototypes of their bags and the designs are fantastic. All the children in Year 6 have been superstars this week and I continue to be impressed by their determination and creativity.

Special Mention: A big shout out to Codey Keyte and Jack Wirtz from Cherry Class who both worked really hard to create an exceptional piece of work about 'Space'. Well done to you both!


