Beech: A great week of hard work! We have been reading a book called "Dinosaurs and All That Rubbish" which helps the reader understand the environment. They have coloured lovely rainbow dinosaurs, photos of which will be displayed around the school. In maths, we have been tackling fractions and working really well. Reception have

been learning all about the stone-age and today they created a den outside and

thought about what you would need to survive in a cave. Beech class are really looking forward to their trip to Oxford Museum next week with Miss Hiddleston and Miss Price.

Willow: This week, year 2 have been learning all about 'Grandad's secret giant'. The children have acted out all the giant's good deeds and inferred with how the main characters have felt throughout the story. As a result year 2 have launched their own random acts of kindness challenge, where they tick off good deeds that they manage to do for their friends, family and community.



Elm: In Elm this week, we have been reading a book called, 'My Painted House, My Friendly Chicken and Me' by Maya Angelo. It is about a girl called Thandi who lives in a village in South Africa.

We have been writing about our on special friends and designing our painted houses, using photographs of the Ndebele people's houses. In maths, we have used bar and cherry models to represent fractions. We are enjoying our hockey lessons with Mr Pemble on Wednesdays and have been playing the "egg" game demonstrating good ball control.



Cherry: Cherry class have started the new term well. The children were particularly keen to find out what their tables names would be, knowing it would be something to do with our new topic: Ancient Egypt. The table groups are all named after Ancient Egyptian gods or mythical figures, ask your child to find out theirs! To start our topic lesson off we worked on placing the Ancient Egyptian era on a timeline; the children were amazed to find quite how long ago Ancient Egyptian civilisation began (approximately 3500BC) and what that looked like in comparison to the Tudor period for example. Over the coming term we will be looking at everything from Egyptian art to mummification, watch this space!

Redwood: Year 6 children have had a busy week settling back in to their routines after half term. A group of children have undertaken their first cycling proficiency session and the whole class took part in an interesting ICT lesson with Mr Wright. We have been writing letters to the Year 5s telling them about life at the top of the school. We have been investigating properties of circles and created circle artwork. We have worked on our tote bags, starting the sewing and preparations for the next stage of development.


